BANNER FOR KNUTSFORD METHODIST CHURCH

I will also work out the amount of fabric required. I suggest we use Bondaweb for the appliqué. I am prepared to iron the Bondaweb onto the fabric but would be grateful for offers of help to cut out the various shapes. I think that rather than a plain blue background it would be simpler if it were pieced so offers of help with that too I would appreciate. By piecing it we could work on sections rather than the whole thing being worked on: it would be easier to put under the sewing machine.

A reminder that the Quilters' Guild is asking people (members or not) if they would make an A4 size quilt for the tombola at the Festival of Quilts in Birmingham, 20-23 August 2009. They can be portrait or landscape, traditional or contemporary and using any technique. They have to be three layers joined by stitch and the edge should be finished appropriately. The quilt should have a label showing the title of your quilt, your name, contact details if you want to provide them, and any information you want to provide about the story behind the quilt. Directions for finding St. John’s and for parking

From M56

Take the A556 towards Chester. After about 2 miles there are a set of lights next to the Swan pub, it is sign-posted left to Knutsford. Turn left at the lights and follow the road until you reach the T-junction on the A50. Turn left towards Knutsford. At the roundabout in Knutsford take the second exit (straight on) on the A50. Keep on the A50 through town; just past the police station (on your right at the first set of lights) turn left down Church Hill. Our church is on the right.

From North Wales and Chester

Take the A556 from North Wales and Northwich. About 1 mile before the motorway there is a set of traffic lights, with a right turn onto the A5033 towards Macclesfield and Knutsford. The A5033 goes back over the M6. Drive into Knutsford until you reach the roundabout; take the third exit onto the A50, towards Kidsgrove and Holmes Chapel. Keep on the A50 through town; just past the police station (on your right at the first set of lights) turn left down Church Hill. Our church is on the right.

From M6 North/South

Take the A556 towards Northwich/Knutsford. After about 0.5 miles there is a set of traffic lights, signposted left A5033 to Knutsford/Macclesfield. Turn left at the lights. The A5033 goes back over the M6. Drive into Knutsford until you reach the roundabout; take the third exit onto the A50, towards Kidsgrove and Holmes Chapel. Keep on the A50 through town; just past the police station (on your right at the first set of lights) turn left down Church Hill. Our church is on the right.

From Macclesfield/East Cheshire

Take the A5033 to Knutsford. At the lights at the top of Adams Hill turn right (signposted M6) and get into the right-hand lane immediately. After going over the pedestrian crossing turn right opposite the court house down Church Hill. Our church is on the right.

Parking

There is limited road-side parking in front of the church (although this is limited to 30 minutes between 9am-6pm Mon-Fri). There is a large car park at the bottom of the hill (go left at the bottom and then immediately right) and you will then be in the pay-and-display car park. This is free after 6 pm Mon-Sat and all day Sunday. Booths’ car park is also free at those times and if you park there, walk out of the car park between the bus station and the police station, cross the roads towards the shops, then take the first road on the left (Church Hill) and the church is on the right.

By Train

Knutsford station is on the Manchester to Chester line - trains run hourly to/from Manchester/Chester. Trains are operated by Northern Rail. The station is a 2 minute walk from St John's. Go up the steps at the end of the platform and you will be on Toft Road. Turn right, go past the Civic Centre, Shell Petrol station, the two take-aways and the dry cleaners and the church is on the right hand side.
